

Pastoral Letter

Maureen's ramblings.....

November is a month which can be overtaken by a sense of "looking back". As the days of Autumn get colder and darker, we look back to the summer which now seems so long ago. I regret all the things I did not get done in the house and garden before the weather changed! I regret not having spent more time lazing in whatever sun we had!!

For the Christian church November is also a month of looking back. On A11 Saint's (November 1st) we reflect with thanksgiving on the lives of great Christians of the past – not just the familiar names but also those who have recently died for their faith. I find it horrendous to learn that upwards of 4,700 Christians are killed each year, an average of 13 per day, accordthe latest estimates. (https://releaseinternational.org). It is not easy to be a Christian in many parts of the world today – especially in Afghanistan, China, Nigeria, Eritrea...... Then, on All Soul's Day (2nd) the church particularly remembers, gratitude, the loss of loved ones dear to us and on Remembrance Sunday (14th) we remember

those who have died in the wars and conflicts of the past 100 years. "We will remember them".

As we look back, we are encouraged to remember and be thankful. Thankful for the people who have lived and died and have shaped our history and our lives; thankful for those who have sacrificed so much for our freedom: thankful for those we have loved and who touched our lives so deeply. And thankful that we can celebrate that death is not the hopeless end but is a hopeful beginning. Our Christian faith teaches us that those who have died now know the mystery of God and are in his presence of love. They are free from the limitations of age and frailty and disease. Surely this is something to celebrate! A verse in the 12th Century hymn, "Jerusalem the Golden" reads, "(In heaven) there is the throne of David: there, from care released, the shout of them that triumph, the song of them that feast; and they, who with Leader, have conquered in the fight, forever and forever, are clad in robes of white". We have a future. We have hope.

In the New Testament book of Revelation, we read "God will shelter them with his presence. Never again will they hunger or thirst. God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain". This gives me such comfort in my grief. The unchanging God is our hope, our courage, our peace, our shelter and our strength - whatever is happening in our lives; whatever the loss, destruction, despair and sorrow that is around us. The

church continues to proclaim, in the darkness of November, that there *is* life after death; there *is* light in the darkness; there *is* Resurrection. There are so many people who understandably find it difficult to believe these things. Why not have a conversation with me, or with Revds. Ali, Adrian or Jane about this?

From Christ Church:

Autumn has started well at Christ Church, with several working parties clearing ivy from the churchyard walls, a bit of an ongoing project, helped along with a coffee and cake break!

Harvest Festival was held this year in the afternoon which was very informal and relaxed, but with the favourite traditional Harvest hymns. Who could have a Harvest service without ploughing the fields and scattering! John Chandler from Five Lanes Farm enlightened us on his life and work in farming. A pleasant social time with tea and cake followed. The gifts of food were taken to Devizes Food Bank, and the monetary collection will be sent to an Afghan Refugee Charity.

A few days later the children, staff and parents of Five Lanes School held their Harvest service in Church, with their songs, reflections, poems and prayers, with their food collection also going to the Food Bank.

Christ Church has a very good relationship with the school, including the Open the Book team which includes some members from St Mary's, Potterne.

The team goes into school, to act and tell Bible stories from the Official Open the Book programme. Most weeks it involves some children as well. They love it, especially when they dress up as biblical soldiers! It takes about 30 minutes from 9am every other Wednesday, plus a couple of meetings a term to plan. We would love new members to join the team, as we are a bit stretched if members have other commitments on a Wednesday. Just let us know if you would like to join us.

An enormous amount of time has been spent by the Ministry team preparing a regular pattern of services for the churches in the Benefice, so that each church will have its own pattern each month. This will be published shortly and begin in the New Year.

The All Souls Service will be held on 31st October at 5pm. This is a quiet reflective service, for families and others to remember those who have died, especially those during the past year. If you have someone you would like mentioned in the prayers, please add the name to the list at the back of church or contact one of us.



RETURN OF THE ADVENT CONCERT!

One of the highlights of the Edington Arts concert season is making a very welcome return on Saturday 4th December at 7.30pm in Edington Priory Church. The hugely popular Advent concert will be given by the choir of Keble College Oxford, Paul Brough conducting.

The Keble College choir last sang for us in 2018, when Matthew Martin conducted. By the time he moved to Cambridge in 2019, his choir had become one of the best of the elite group of Oxford and Cambridge College choirs. Paul Brough, who took over, is one of the leading choral directors in the UK, and a great friend of Edington through the festival. Having negotiated their way through a year of rehearsal and tuition by Zoom, the singers are overjoyed to be back singing 'live' and we can be sure that they will give us a memorable evening of Advent and Christmas music – just what we need after last year's cancellations.

Demand for this concert is already brisk, and Edington Arts is encouraging anyone who would like to come to reserve seats for themselves, friends and family as soon as possible. Tickets remain at £20/15/10, with 18 and under free, and Edington Angels have their usual 10% discount.

For this concert, the North and South Aisle seats (£10), will be unreserved and audience members may sit where they like within these areas; all other areas will be reserved and seats allocated. Worton Parish Council

We have all become aware of just how important technology and the internet in particular are in our everyday lives. The rigours of the pandemic have acted as a catalyst and most of us have grasped the potential that exists to use available technology to communicate effectively and support each other through challenging times. Whilst by no means a panacea or substitute for good old-fashioned face-toface friendships and dealing with day-to-day necessities, I think, on the whole, the increased familiarity and confidence in the use of the facilities available has been one of the few benefits of the pandemic. Another is the strength of our village community, and the Worton and Marston community group on Facebook has played an important role in its success. Sadly, the other side of social media has recently raised its head sufficiently to cause real concern and upset. Those of us who have dipped our toe in the various sites and apps that are available have soon learned that the platform given on which views can be aired, seemingly without much care, thought or appreciation of impact, needs to be approached with caution.

It is my experience that many users simply enjoy the opportunity to engage in what they may regard as "banter" as a matter of course, not considering that others may find their views upsetting or, perhaps, insulting.

Recently, we have become aware of particularly unpleasant contributions to our village Facebook site. Whilst the specific issue has, I understand, been dealt with in the appropriate fashion, I feel the need to make a plea on behalf of the Parish Council, that we all remember the power of careless words and give careful thought to what we post on the site, as well as how we respond. The Parish Council has just adopted a new Social Media Policy which we will adhere to. Please remember to be kind and considerate to your fellows - healthy debate will always be encouraged and respected, but social media sites are probably not the best place for us!

On a related issue, we have noticed that there has been lively interest in some of the issues that we deal with in our meetings, traffic speed through the village being a good example. The best way to share views and ideas on this is by attending our monthly meetings. Can we politely request that, if you do wish to raise an issue, you let Liz,

our clerk, know before a meeting (we need at least a week's notice to comply with the rules about how and when agendas are circulated), so that those views can be properly considered? Please use the usual email address - clerk@worton.org.uk.

Cllr Powell has been working on the outline of a Parish Plan which he presented at our October meeting. The purpose is to have an overall idea of what we expect to be the important issues for the next four years and to plan as effectively as we can. As it stands, the main areas identified are..

- Transport and road safety Completion of purchase and installation of speed indicator devices, investigate the establishment of a 40mph zone on the eastern approach to the village and engage with other bodies with regard to the improvement of the Black Dog crossroads.
- Leisure facilities, Appearance and Environment Establishment of village maintenance group, improvements to play areas, new footpath trail.
- Planning Re-establishment of Neighbourhood Planning Steering group.
- Community and learning Village history project.

If you have any suggestions for any additions, please let us know via the usual channels. Whilst on the subject, Malcolm is pleased with the responses to his request for volunteers to contribute to the Village Maintenance group, but more would be very welcome. In a similar vein, we are still short of two Parish Councillors. Please give the opportunity some serious thought - Don't be shy!

A quick update on our purchase of Speed Indicator Devices. All is looking good at the moment, thanks to the work of Cllrs Slack, Parsons and, of course, Susanne and her team. Suitable sites have been identified, as has the equipment needed. We are waiting for confirmation of when Wiltshire Council will finalise their contribution to the funding, which should be at the next CATG meeting, scheduled for November.

Finally, whilst the funds available to us as a Parish Council are limited, there is a source of funding available which village organisations, or even potentially individuals, can apply to in relation to

Luckily the matter has been dealt with and, undeterred, our intrepid volunteer has been Speed Watching again since, trying as always to help keep the road safe and get motorists to slow down.

We can ignore motorists who gesticulate and shout abuse at us as they drive past. However, we wouldn't expect abuse from one of our own residents.



A Message from Tamara Reay Wiltshire Councillor for The Devizes Rural West Division

The fuel issues over the last few weeks will have undoubtedly prompted many of us to consider the benefits of electric vehicles (EVs). Not only lower running costs and fewer emissions but also that EVs are simpler and cheaper to maintain, compared to traditional combustion engines. As Wiltshire Council's Portfolio Holder for Climate Change, and given that Transport currently accounts for 45% of carbon emissions across the County, I have been making a strong case for further Council-led investment in EV infrastructure. Whilst consideration needs to be given to the fact that the technology is rapidly developing, and Government policy is also evolving.

I am very pleased therefore, that Wiltshire Council has now agreed an EV strategy for the next few years and that this £275,000 plan will ensure there are more EV chargers throughout the county. In Wiltshire Council car parks, every urban community with a population over 10,000 will have at least one council-sponsored public chargepoint, and the council will support commercial providers to add their own chargers.

In terms of residential charging, where residents do not have their own off-street facilities, Wiltshire Council will support town and parish councils to secure grant funding for residential chargepoints on Wiltshire Council land using Government grants supplemented by Council grants of up to £2,500 per site. It is also looking for partners to consider the installation of charging hubs, at central and out of town locations, and also adding more chargepoints to its own buildings so the Council fleet can be converted to electric vehicles. There will be support for businesses to install workplace chargepoints, and all chargepoints on council-owned land will be supplied with energy from 100% zero-carbon sources.

There are other considerations too, and this month's COP26 in Glasgow may give us some insights. For example, what role will Hydrogen play in the future? Can we generate sufficient green energy to create the future charging capacity? And how will the carbon footprint of the EV batteries be reduced? We are certainly at an important crossroads in terms of how we travel, and I am very much looking forward to being part of that journey, and helping residents across Devizes Rural West to be able to travel more sustainably in the future.

ECO-CORNER

As we watch Cop 26 unfold in Glasgow this month when more than 120 countries join the global climate race to zero carbon-emissions, we are encouraged not to forget Cop15 which is convening governments from around the world - online from 11 October with more detailed discussions in Kunming, China, in April - to agree **new goals for nature** for the next decade.

Global biodiversity losses pose a threat to human wellbeing, affecting food, health, security, and increasing the likelihood of pandemics. *Natural History Museum* considers that ecosystem losses pose as much of a threat to the planet as the climate crisis and that the solutions are linked.

Worryingly for the UK, an analysis by the Museum has revealed that the UK, with an average of only 53% of its biodiversity left, is in the bottom 10% of the world's countries and last in the G7! https://www.nhm.ac.uk/discover/news/2021/october/analysis-warns-global-biodiversity-is-below-safe-limit.html

To help policymakers compare the state of local ecosystem biodiversity among countries, the Museum has developed the *Biodiversity Trends Explorer* to track biodiversity change. So what actions might we as individuals take for nature?

The UK needs millions more trees to reach its 2050 carbon net-zero target. By digging in with the Woodland Trust, we'll help bring the UK (and the Queen in her Jubilee Year!) nearer this important goal: https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/plant-trees/schools-and-communities/






