Our November meeting was well attended and we were, as always, impressed by a display of flower arranging by local expert, Pam Lewis. Pam had been at a class all day, which shows you can always learn something new. She showed us two items she had made there, and went on to explain how the flower arranging world now try and avoid where possible, the use of Oasis, as it is not bio-degradable! Sadly some of the substitutes are not much better so we must all be careful not to let bits of oasis go down sinks as pieces may well end up in the sea.

So some of Pam's arrangements were made by using covered insulation boards, and attaching orchid tubes (a bit like test tubes) to them. A little water in the tubes, then flowers and foliage are inserted into them. Some members have pictures so just ask if you want to see them. Pam did one arrangement using Oasis, though, which was a beautiful green and yellow one on a gold platter and a big white candle in the centre. Another was an upright Christmas Tree shape with orange flowers and greenery put into the aforementioned tubes. Stunning! A great idea for a shelf or windowsill was a display of 3 covered tins with water in, and arrangements of foliage and flowers, simply put in the water in the tins. I say simply, but Pam, of course, makes it look simple.

We were very grateful to Pam for giving up her evening and everyone thoroughly enjoyed themselves, especially those who won arrangements in the raffle!!

We will have lots of lovely stalls with organisations who regularly use the Hall providing cakes and gifts for sale as well as some of the regular competitions such as the bottle stall. In addition some talented villagers will be selling their wares, from honey to wooden crafts, from glassware to cards...so plenty of opportunity for some Christmas shopping ... and to complete the afternoon, Trustees will be providing teas/coffees/squash and cake for donations and mulled wine for sale.

Chair

We are still seeking someone who will take the role of Chair. Without a Chair the hall will have to close as the Charity Commission will not let us function without one. The role of the Chair is not that onerous since we have a really proactive Trustee group to support you. Our current Chair (me) will stay on for a while to help initiate you if you'd like but I'm moving to Devon soon so will be working long-distance and it would be good to know there is someone willing to pick up the role. Please contact me if you are remotely interested. It might sound a bit daunting but it isn't really and it is very rewarding.

Kitchen

The kitchen plans are progressing well. We hope to go out for tenders shortly with a view to choosing a contractor. The provision of the new kitchen will inevitably cause some disruption but we will update you on this once we are at the contract negotiating stage. I have agreed to stay on to complete this (hopefully not as Chair but as a co-opted Trustee for this purpose).

Warm Spaces

We would very much like to open the Hall on Saturday afternoons in January and February for people to come for a warm up and a cup of tea and cake. BUT Trustees do not have the capacity to do this alone. I know there are a number of you who said they would like to help at the Hall without actually becoming a Trustee so here's your chance!! We are looking for you to volunteer to organise one Saturday afternoon in either January or February. It will entail, opening up, putting out tables and chairs, making teas and coffees in the afternoon and

maybe making cake beforehand (or buying it). The Village Hall will provide the tea/coffee/sugar/squash for children. You will need to bring milk and cake ... keep receipts and we can reimburse these too. You will also need to clear away tables and chairs but usually all who attend will help with this. Worton Parish Council

I thought I would take the opportunity to share some background and alleviate some concerns about Worton and Marston's joint project to have WORT 11 and MARS 10, which are bridleways and WORT 13 which is a footpath to be recognised as **Queen's Platinum Jubilee Walkways".** This is an honorary title recognising the connection of our villages to wider history, heritage and culture. It represents a remarkable achievement for our two communities and gives us an ongoing recognition of the two villages that we love.

Before I share some information about the concept and what it can mean, I feel the need to deal with the practicalities. No changes will be made to any of the pathways as a result of this. **No names will change!** Church Lane remains the same. As will WORT 11 and 13, Back Lane, and the wonderfully named MARS 10. There is absolutely no intention to make any changes to public (or private) thoroughfares or land. The title is largely symbolic -though it makes a statement about us.

The concept of Royal Walkways goes back to the Queen's Silver Jubilee in the 1970's. Since then there have been a number of designations of Walkways and titles, though they share a common aim and theme. All have been granted the right to use the insignia of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and aim....

"to preserve and protect the physical and mental health of people, advance their education in relation to natural and cultural heritage and promote conservation, protection and improvement of the historical and natural environment" (quote from the Commonwealth Walkway website: https://commonwealthwalkway.info/about-us/)

The original Walkway is in London and there are Queen's Jubilee Walkways in Windsor, Glasgow, Poole, Bristol and the newest in Birmingham, as well as Commonwealth Walkways in many countries of the Commonwealth. The towns awarded Queen's Walkway status have all included pictures on their websites and shown pride in their plaques.

The honour that we have been given is one of a very small number linked to our late Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Due to her sad passing, we will in all probability be amongst the last Walkways to be established -so there is a responsibility there!

So where do we go from here?

We want to make the Jubilee Walkway a project that the whole community can participate in. There are various ways in which this can be done which we will consider at our December meeting. Once established, we can consider how better to use the Walkway status to promote our history and values and be something for all of us to be proud of. If anyone still has any concerns about this initiative, would like more information, or, even better, would like to be involved, please contact Jules at clerk@worton.org.uk.

The Parish Council has given considerable scrutiny to the content and implications of Wiltshire's Local Plan, which I shared details of last month. Once the new housing estate has been built at the eastern end of the village, the great majority of the "target" we have been set in terms of new homes will have been met, so there should be no significant changes in the foreseeable future. We, and other comparable villages, have done all we can to ensure that any changes are reasonable and in line with the stated objective of "sustainability". For us in particular, we continue to be concerned that we are supported in the service provision needed by a "large" village and that our local views are listened to and respected.

We continue to have an eye on the traffic related issues that we know concern many residents and are working closely with Wiltshire Council, particularly the LH FIG group in this respect.

Some residents are still raising concerns about issues such as footpath safety. If these are communicated to Jules, our clerk (clerk@worton.org.uk) we will endeavour to use the support of the Parish Steward to deal with them as soon as we can. However, please be aware of the facility of the "My Wilts" portal as the best way to

deal with more urgent issues and those beyond the Parish Council remit.

Those of us who enjoy walking in the village will be aware of the problems in using the path by Mill Race. This has been looked at in detail in the hope of finding a solution. Unfortunately, the long term prognosis does not look good, in the views of the experts (in this case the Environment Agency). We will share more on the topic when the position is clearer.

Lastly, we have a plan to deal better with a problem near to everyone's heart (or should I say feet?) in the form of overflowing dog poo bins. Again, watch this space.

Please note that our December meeting will begin at 6 PM in order to avoid a clash with the Beer and Carols at the Pub scheduled for the same date to allow choristers (and drinkers) to attend both.

Semington Brook

Residents will be aware that the recent bad weather has exacerbated some of the long-standing issues relating to Semington Brook and that Worton 10 has been closed. I want to assure you that I have been working, since I was elected in 2021, to secure solutions. This includes working with Worton and Marston Parish Councils, the Environment Agency, Wiltshire Council Rights of Way officers, and affected local residents to make progress. At a recent meeting I asked the Environment Agency for their expert assessment of the causes. Please see the note below.

Readers of The Bridge are probably wondering who is responsible? I am afraid that is more than slightly complicated. As you will see below - the Environment Agency is of the view that the deterioration of the Mill Leat embankment which was created some hundreds of years ago is NOT due to the operation of the Worton Sluice or The Mill, but natural degradation.

You will know that over the years various repairs have been done to keep the water in the watercourse. Sadly though, it now seems likely that further repairs may well only have a temporary benefit and would not be a good use of public money. Whilst Worton and Marston Parish Councils do not have a legal responsibility for this, Councillors have of course been working closely with me to represent local interests and monitor the brook on a daily basis, and I would like to thank them for all their work.

What is happening now? We are progressing two courses of action:

In the Short Term: Unfortunately, the recent breach close to the sluice has exposed power cables and the power to the sluice has therefore been switched off. The Environment Agency is looking at a temporary solution to stem the breach. Beyond this, there are concerns about the overall effectiveness of any further repairs.

In the Longer Term: The community need to agree the long-term strategy for the Semington Brook and we will be working to consider the impacts and opportunities of this for local landowners, residents and the natural environment.

Thank you for your patience. As you will appreciate there is a real risk of banks collapsing - please do not seek to contravene any closed Rights of Way. I will of course keep you informed about further developments.

Semington Brook - Mill Stream banks

The Semington Brook has had a Mill located on it probably since the 1600s and therefore the alteration of the watercourse and the creation of a Mill Leat has been established over a long period of time. The purpose of the Mill Leat is to supply water to Worton Mill at a 'head' which is high enough to drive the water wheel back in the time when the Mill was a working Mill. The height of this water level is above the original watercourse and the existing flood plain – see Fig 1 on next page.

From approximately just upstream of Ray Bridge along the Mill Leat to the Worton Mill, the left bank of the Leat is an embankment, which was created by heaped spoil from the river. Back in the early days, this bank would not have been an engineered bank of compacted cohesive material as modern engineered banks would be and therefore watertight. Over the years, these banks become porous and have deteriorated. A number of leakage points have been repaired over previous decades. If the river has crayfish in, these creatures are burrowing and may well exacerbate the issues in the banks.

It's our opinion that the water level fluctuations caused by the operation of the Worton Sluice or the Mill have not caused the porosity of the banks.





A Snapshot of the History of Marston

Called Merstone in 1309, derived from a Saxon name mersctun (marsh settlement).

In the early 1600s Potterne Manorial Court asked the Inhabitants of Marston to repair the ditch known as 'le gripp' leading from Marston to Bulkington. The villagers were also told not to let their pigs roam in the lanes of Marston.

1646 saw Potterne and Marston grievously visited by the plague.

A survey of the Manor of Potterne carried out by John May in 1656 shows many houses in Marston that have long since disappeared. A similar map, dated a year later, clearly shows the cobblestone path which probably joined up with a causeway that came from Potterne.

The bridge leading from Worton to Marston called Ray Bridge was in 1740 out of repair and dangerous to travellers and the Marston Supervisors of the Highway were asked to make repairs within two months. These Supervisors or Surveyors of the Highways were responsible for the upkeep of the lanes, bridges and drains in the parish. Their account books make fascinating reading and in those days labour was one shilling per day.

Between 1815 and 1830 George Watson-Taylor was building up the Erlestoke Estate and by the time the Wiltshire Tithe Apportionment was agreed in 1841, there were 33 landowners in Marston. The main owners being: George Watson-Taylor (405 acres), Valentine Hale Mairis (107 acres) and Martha May (63 acres). Marston had 525 acres of meadow, 320 acres of arable land and 26 acres that were lanes etc.

By 1835 the Chapel had been built (Primitive Methodists in those days) and by 1841 Christ Church had also been built after £1200 had been raised mainly by subscription.

Most of the houses that had been built in Marston prior to the end of the 19th century were built from bricks made from local clay, the majority of which would have come from local brickworks either on the outskirts of Worton or at Stoke's Marsh, Coulston. The latter probably belonged to the Watson-Taylors, their bricks being bigger than most, perhaps to reduce the brick tax paid?

The first Parish Meeting for Marston was held on 4th December 1894 and Charles Frederick Biggs was elected chairman. By June 1899 ap-

proval had been given to make a new road between Worton and Marston in place of the footpath and bridleway. Until then the Horse Road had been the main way through between the two villages.

In June 1910 much of the Erlestoke Estate was sold including most of the Watson-Taylor's property in Marston. What remained was sold in 1920.

The Grip appeared to still be an important source of water in Marston in the 1920s, with much correspondence with the Ecclesiastical Commission in London regarding keeping it clean. The villagers depended on the water for domestic use, a 'dipping place for water'.

In her Memories from Childhood, Jean Carter tells of her life on a farm in the 1920s, and how very different it was from life today. Families were virtually self-sufficient, the days were long and work was hard and manual. Pigs and chickens were kept for food and butter was made once a week. Haymaking was a very hard job with long hours as it was all done by hand and horses. The toilet was a little wooden house at the bottom of the garden and the only lighting in the home was oil lamps and candles. The children walked to school at Worton and although school life was very strict, at Christmas there was a party with presents. Saturday night was bath night, with the water coming from a well in the garden. Monday was washing day, Tuesday ironing day and on Wednesday the eggs had to be cleaned and counted ready to be taken to Devizes Market on Thursday.

Marston was known as Marston in the Mud, the lanes were very muddy as seven herds of cows were driven four times a day from farm to field or field to farm until the weather got too bad for pasture feeding.

In 1937 the Coronation of George VI was celebrated with Worton and during the war years American soldiers were frequent visitors to the Plough Inn as they were stationed at Erlestoke Park. Italian prisoners of war worked on some of the farms in Marston and some families had evacuees from London.

After the War, the Parish Meeting continued to oversee Marston and deal with many local issues, including taking over the Green from the Church Commissioners, getting a telephone kiosk and in 1954 a Coronation seat.

In 1958 a Parish Council for Marston was established and in 1960 it

was agreed to build a bus shelter. Times were changing in Marston and by April 1978 there was concern about the high level of soil round the Jubilee oak tree due to the Green improvements being done by Pearces. Unfortunately by 1984 the oak tree was dead and had been cut down.
